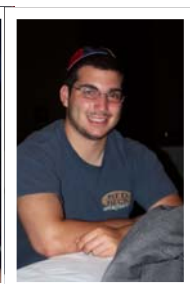

FROM THE RABBI

RABBI DAVID CANTOR



I have two sons: Joash is an American Citizen; Avniel is not.

To become a citizen, Avniel must (1) show that he is person of good moral character, (2) demonstrate that he believes in and is committed to the principles of the constitution of the United States, (3) be able to read, write, speak, and understand English, and (4) demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the history and of the principles and form of government in the United States.

Being born in the USA, Joash is a citizen, even if he is immoral, indifferent, illiterate, or ignorant.

To become a citizen, Avniel must be both loyal and patriotic; to remain a citizen, Joash must avoid disloyalty and sedition.

Both Kedma and I are Jews: me because my mother was a Jew at the time of my birth (still is!); Kedma because she chose to become a Jew.

To become a Jew, Kedma had to (1) show that she was committed to living a Jewish life, (2) demonstrate a belief in God and a commitment to the Jewish people, (3) learn to read Hebrew, and (4) study Jewish history, philosophy, and theology.

Being born of a Jewish mother, I am a Jew, even if I am unobservant, agnostic, unaffiliated, illiterate, or ignorant.

To become a Jew, Kedma had to become both observant and affiliated; to remain a Jew, I really don't need to do anything at all.

There is a similarity between being and becoming an American and being and becoming a Jew in that a higher standard is demanded both of the naturalized citizen and the Jew by choice. Birth conveys a privilege: a natural born citizen, no matter how immoral, indifferent, illiterate, or ignorant they may be, is still eligible to become the President of the United States; a natural born Jew, no matter how unobservant, agnostic, unaffiliated, illiterate, or ignorant, still counts in a minyan, can still be given an aliyah to the Torah.

In both, an oath, said before a court, must be taken: here is what Avniel will have to swear, to become a citizen like his older brother:

I hereby declare, on oath, that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty, of whom or which I have heretofore been a subject or citizen; that I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States of America against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I will bear arms on behalf of the United States when required by the law; that I will perform noncombatant service in the armed forces of the United States when required by the law; that I will perform work of national importance under civilian direction when required by the law; and that I take this obligation freely without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; so help me God.

Here is the oath I require of my candidates for conversion:

I hereby affirm, of my own free will and volition, my commitment to the God of Israel, the Torah of Israel, and the people of Israel. I pray that my present conviction may guide me through life, that I may be worthy of the sacred tradition and community of which I am a member. As I am thankful for the privileges thus bestowed upon me, I pray that I may always remain conscious of the obligations that are mine as a member of the House of Israel. Today I hereby pledge myself to live the Jewish way of holiness, by accepting the mitzvot of Judaism now and always, here and wherever I may be. In preparation for this moment, I have sought both to infuse my life with Jewish values and to create a distinctively Jewish atmosphere in my home.

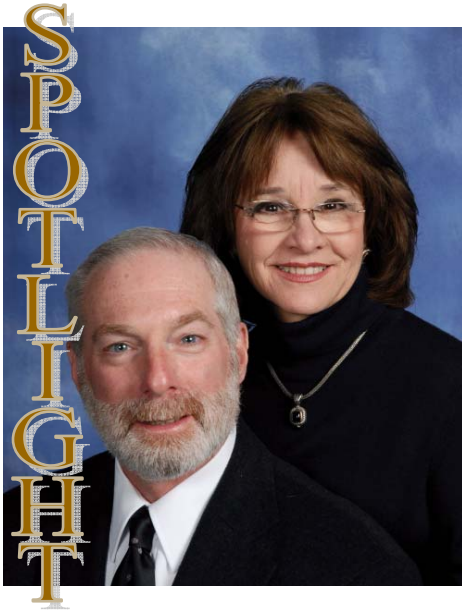
Specifically, I declare that I have determined, to the best of my ability, to make the following Jewish observances an integral part of both my life and that of my family:

- By entering all sons born to or adopted by me into the covenant of Abraham, through the ritual of Brit Milah;
- By welcoming all daughters born to or adopted by me into the Jewish community by naming her in accordance with Jewish tradition;
- By giving these children a quality Jewish education;
- By making Shabbat and Jewish holidays important moments of holiness in my home and by opening my home to others so that I may become God's partner in sharing the holiness of sacred time with those who are searching or in need;
- By enhancing my observance of Shabbat and Jewish holidays by lighting candles, reciting Kiddush and Birkat Hamazon, and performing other rituals distinctive for each holy day;
- By incorporating kashrut into my life and by sharing my bread with others who are hungry;
- By affiliating with the Jewish people through a synagogue and attending religious services;
- By praying regularly, either at synagogue or at home, using the Jewish liturgy as the basis of worship;
- By remembering those who are ill and visiting them;
- By participating in the life of the Jewish community through supporting religious and communal institutions in Israel and the Diaspora and by dedicating my life to making this world a better place in which to live, for all people;
- By identifying with the State of Israel, the Jewish homeland, the center of Jewish hopes and aspirations;
- By engaging in Jewish study on a continuing basis.

I pray that in all these ways, I may continue to grow in the love of Judaism and find blessing because of my decision to live the Jewish way of holiness and accept the mitzvot of Judaism. By affirming my commitment to Judaism and the Jewish people, may I add my willing heart and hands to our eternal task of being God's partners in seeking to perfect the world under God's universal sovereignty.

I hope we can all agree that, in an ideal world, natural born Americans should be

When you have lived all over the world, changing countries every two or three years, you get used to involving yourself in a new community. For Central Intelligence Agency veterans, Steven and Carolyn Sherman, retiring to Chattanooga was all in a day's work, with a twist. Chattanooga is not an assignment but a choice, and they plan on staying. The seeds they plant in Chattanooga will grow and blossom far into the future.

Steven grew up in Lakewood, New Jersey until he was a teenager and his family moved to Connecticut. He graduated from the University of New Haven and worked in law enforcement before being recruited by the CIA where he and Carolyn met. They have been married for twelve years. Carolyn has three daughters from a previous marriage and one granddaughter. Steven has two sons, a daughter, and three grandchildren. Plans are underway for some of the clan to visit Chattanooga during the summer.

In December 2009, the Shermans made Chattanooga their home although plans had been in the works for a few years. Carolyn's native New Orleans had been their original retirement destination, but Hurricane Katrina, and the losses suffered by Carolyn's family, made a higher and drier location seem more prudent. They had visited Chattanooga on their travels and found its scenic appeal captivating. In preparation for their eventual move, they purchased their home in 2006.

Community involvement started right away. Carolyn is active in Hadassah, the Federation, Lookout Valley Neighborhood Association, and the Black Creek Ladies' Club. Steven is a member of a program advisory committee for a local college. He is also serving on a Federation committee working to bring a Jazz Festival to Chattanooga. As a guitar, trumpet, French horn, and budding banjo player, he is an excellent choice to promote music. They regularly attend services at B'nai Zion, and Carolyn is completing studies for conversion. The Shermans are actively engaged in the arts and enjoy ballet, opera, and Broadway shows. In addition to attending cultural events in Chattanooga, they have been to numerous events in Atlanta and Nashville.

The Shermans have found B'nai Zion and Chattanooga to be warm and inviting. This warmth and sincerity have contributed immeasurably to the Shermans' conviction that settling in Chattanooga was indeed an intelligent decision. held up to the same standards as naturalized Americans: to be moral, loyal, patriotic, literate, and knowledgeable. Immigrants become citizens through a process of vetting, culminating in an appearance before a judge; natural born citizens should aspire to be worthy of naturalization.

Likewise, I would hope we can all agree that in an ideal world, Jews by birth should be held up to the same standards as Jews by choice: to be observant, affiliated, literate, and knowledgeable. Proselytes are transformed into Jews by participating in a course of study and introspection, followed by an appearance before a panel of rabbis; Jews by birth should aspire to be worthy of conversion.

Whether one is a Jew by birth or choice, just as I believe that there is a value in asking every American to be willing to be bound by the Oath of Citizenship – over and above the Pledge of Allegiance – so too I believe there is a value for every Jew to consider the question: *If it turned out that my mother wasn't Jewish, would I choose to be Jewish, would I be willing to swear to be bound by the Oath of conversion – over and above the Shema?*

Rabbi Cantor will be on vacation during the month of July; during this time he will continue to check his email and answer his cell phone if you call.

As Beit Sefer Ivri winds down...

The year is over for Beit Sefer Ivri. Soon our students will begin travelling for vacation, packing for camps and settling in for the break that is summer! It's a great time to re-energize and focus for the next year.

Part of my summer plan always includes a simple project: cleaning my office. I've always found the process very therapeutic. I will take all of the random papers lying around and make one large stack on my desk. It usually includes curriculum books, copies of various Torah readings and service parts, catalogs, calendars, yet to be filed forms, budget information and much, much more. No scrap is too large or too small. Once the mound is completed, I start to move around my office. I start at the door and go over every surface. I begin by putting away books that have been out since High Holy Days, pens that have piled up in all kinds of random places and snacks that have lingered since Purim. After this, I take a few minutes and read through David Allen's book "Getting Things Done". It's an excellent resource for staying organized. His workflow diagram is a holy document in my office.

Once everything is picked up and put away, I start the real work. I sit at my desk with some relaxing music

and begin to go through the mound of paper, piece by piece. Basically I ask myself if this piece of paper requires some sort of action. If the answer is yes, I invoke the two minute rule: if it takes two minutes to complete, I do it immediately. In just a few short hours, the pile can be whittled down to nearly nothing.

While it all sounds very mechanical, I find it to be a wonderful exercise. I can contemplate the entire year: from the scribbled notes of a program idea to the holiday coloring pages to the order of service from Yom Kippur. Each of these items holds a memory that is brought back to consider. It's amazing to savor those recollections for a few seconds. We can learn great lessons from our memories. However, there comes a time to file it away, and begin our year with a clean slate.

The mound on my desk has grown very large the last few days and it is time for me to begin my review. Have a great summer!

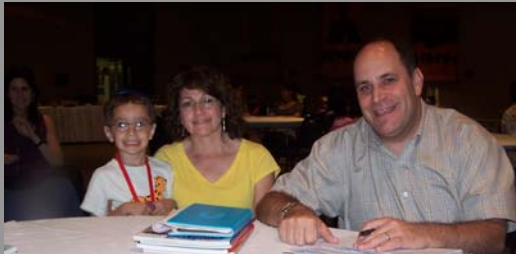

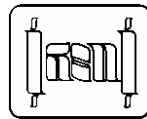
